CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Capital's Master of Arts – Clinical Mental Health Counseling provides the required foundation to become a licensed professional counselor in the state of Ohio and to work in an array of mental health settings. You will learn about mental health diagnoses, as well as how to treat mental and emotional disorders with a wide variety of counseling theories and techniques. The program fosters the attitudes, dispositions, and skills to promote strong professional identity, and prepares you to become a leader in the profession through teaching, advocacy, research, and professional clinical experience.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

- The total anticipated cost for the Counseling program (either degree) including tuition and fees is **\$44,684***
- Tuition is assessed on a per credit hour basis. The tuition rate for the 2023-24 academic year is \$686 per credit hour
- Graduate assistantships may be available
- Federal financial aid is available to assist in financing your education
- Capital University accepts the GI bill and other veteran benefits

- Minimum grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 (B)
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions
- Three Letters of Recommendation
- Interview with Program Directors
