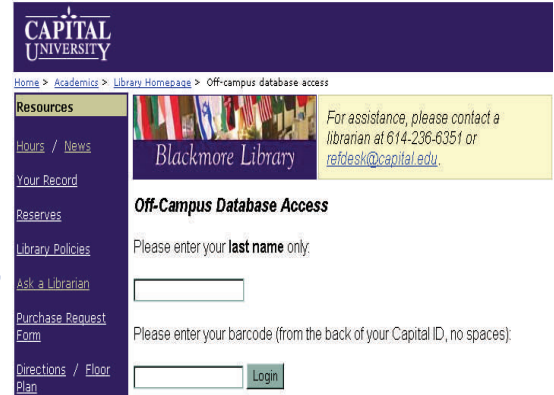

Off-Campus access to JSTOR databases and more...

Blackmore Library has contracted with OhioNet to provide Off-campus access for twenty plus databases which previously had no Off-campus access. Primarily among these databases is the JSTOR databases of Arts and Sciences. The list includes:

African American History, ATLA Religion Database, Biography Resource Center, College Source, EconLit, Ethnic News Watch, Facts.com, Gender Watch, Grove Dictionary of Music, Hoover's Online, Issues/Controversies, Iiter with Iiter Italicum, Mental Measurements, Music Index Online, Naxos, Proquest Nursing Journals, Philosopher's Index, Physical Education Index, Social Work Abstracts, SportsDiscus and Women Writers.

Blackmore Library to administer National Library Quality Survey in March

As part of Capital University's ongoing commitment to assessment, the Blackmore Library is once again participating in the LibQUAL + survey. The survey is a web-based questionnaire to measure library user satisfaction. The survey will run from March 15th through the end of April and is open to all Capital University students, faculty, and staff.

The survey was created by the Association of Research Libraries and Texas A&M University. It is adapted from the widely tested and accepted SERVQUAL survey, a service and quality survey tool used by for-profit companies. Over 200 other institutions worldwide will be participating in the 2005 survey, including several other Ohio universities.

The results of this anonymous survey will help the library identify what it is currently doing right and what areas need improvement. Since the library participated in the survey in 2002, it will also allow the library to compare the results with those from the previous survey.

Participants have the option of entering into a drawing for four \$25 gift certificates for the University bookstore.

EBSCOHost adds ATLA Religion Database

ATLA Religion Database is the premier index to journal articles, book reviews, and collections of essays in all fields of religion. Subjects: antiquities and archaeology, Bible, church history, ecumenism, ethics, missions, pastoral ministry, philosophy, religions and religious studies, theology. The database includes more than 1.3 million bibliographic records for journal articles, more than 200,000 essay citations, and more than 400,000 book review citations. Links are provided to 100,000 full text articles from more than fifty journals. This database is produced by the American Theological Library Association and includes:

2. Religion Index Two: Multi-Author Works (RIT)
3. Index to Book Reviews in Religion (IBRR)
4. Retrospective Indexing Project (RIP)
