ATLA Religion Database

Beginning the middle of December the new full-text version of the ATLA Religion Database will be available to Capital University. Compiled by the American Theological Library Association the ATLA journals cover Biblical Studies, Ethics, Archaeology, Theology, Philosophy, Comparative Religions, Pastoral Ministry and Missions. There will be links to over 50,000 full-text articles and book reviews.

Biomed Central publishes 104 open access online journals across the whole spectrum of biology and medicine.
