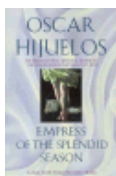

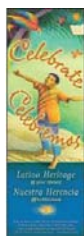
Blackmore Library in The Dispatch

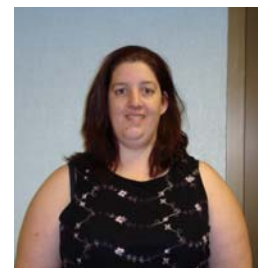
