As a result of a student suggestion, the library will now open at 7:30 AM Monday - Friday to allow students more time to print materials before their 8 AM classes. We continue to encourage you to send us your suggestions via online or to the suggestion box located by the Returns counter.

The Reference staff has had a busy year, providing library instruction to over 70 classes. Through these instructional sessions, the librarians have been able to reach over 1500 students. To access, do a "Course Search" for "Library" in Blackboard and then enroll. Once you are enrolled in the course, you will be able to access all of our instructional PowerPoints, arranged by subject.

## Patron Perks With Frequent User Card

The Blackmore Library Frequent User Program will be rolling out at the beginning of next semester, January 5<sup>th</sup>. You can pick up a Frequent User Card at both the Service and Information Desks. The Frequent User Card has 12 icons of books on the front. Anytime you complete a circulation or reference transaction, you may earn one stamp. On the back of the card, there is a space for your name and e-mail. After all 12 book icons are stamped, you can return your card to the Reference staff at the Information Desk. You will receive a library tote bag and your card will be entered into a drawing at the end of the semester for a gift card.



## OCLC Cite This!

A new feature called "Cite This" was recently added to our library catalog. When you search for an item in the catalog and bring up the record, there is a link for "Cite This (from OCLC)" located just underneath the author, title and publisher information. After clicking the link, you can see how the title is cited according to various style formats, including ALA, MLA, Chicago, and Turabian. You can copy and paste the citation into your citation page, but always remember to check that the formatting is correct.

The *Religion and Philosophy Collection* is an EBSCOhost database that covers such topics as world religions, biblical studies, religious history, epistemology, political philosophy, philosophy of language, moral philosophy and the history of philosophy. It contains over 290 full text journals and is updated weekly. You can access the *Religion and Philosophy Collection* from both on and off-campus by doing a title search in our catalog or by the Find Articles link and then click on Listed by Name, P-Q.



There are some helpful new pages on the library website. Under Student Links, there is now a link to Borrowing Policies. The Borrowing Policies page contains the Circulation Policies and InterLibrary Loan Brochure in PDF format.
