PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Bachelor of Arts in Music degree is the Conservatory's most flexible and customizable degree. It is specifically designed for students who wish to major in music and pursue a second area of study outside of the Conservatory. In the first two years of study, students take courses that provide a solid foundation in one of several music concentrations including theory, history, technology, business industry, or performance. The third and fourth years of study are dedicated to requirements in the student's second choice of a major or minor program. Many of our BA in Music students choose to pursue a second degree in business, public relations, psychology, communication, religion, in addition to others. The possibilities are waiting for you.

CAREERS AND PLACEMENT

Many of our graduates have pursued a master's of music in music therapy or music cognition, while others have pursued their MBA. Our program is focused on combining your love of music with another field you are passionate about, and enabling you to explore both of your chosen areas of study.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The first two years of study in the Bachelor of Arts in Music program provides classes and learning experiences that focus on the music portion of the degree. Learning experiences include performance work, production, and music technology experiences in the Conservatory. During the last two years of study, experiential learning activities such as internships, practicums, and field work are guided by the program and faculty in your second area of concentration.

CONSERVATORY ADMISSION AND AUDITION

Admission into this program will require you to complete a two-part process to gain admittance to both Capital University and the Conservatory of Music. Once you are academically admitted to Capital, you will be required to participate in an audition with your specific instrument or in your area of interest. This will help the Conservatory determine your musical qualifications and placement.
