# Jazz Studies

#### **Program Overview**

Capital's jazz studies degree was first introduced in 1976, making it one of the longest-established programs in the nation. Since then, the degree has produced countless outstanding musicians who have achieved success in the music industry. Our definition of "Jazz" includes everything from traditional/straight ahead, big band, funk, fusion, afro-Cuban, Brazilian, rock, and the avant-garde. This performance-based degree focuses on diverse ensemble experiences and myriad playing opportunities found in our two big bands, small combos, rock ensemble, world music labs and more.

The jazz area faculty, led by Capital alumni Julie Licata, consists of a veritable "who's who" in the local Columbus scene–all of whom can be found gigging in clubs, venues, and concert halls across the country. In addition, the program hosts guest artists and clinicians throughout the year, culminating in the annual Jazz & World Music Festival which brings world-renowned musicians to work with students for a whole week. Recent guests have included Patrick Bartley, the Bobby Floyd Trio, Rebeca Mauleón, the DIVA Quintet, and Jaak Sooäär. Each student will find a truly one-one connection with their studio teachers, class professors, ensemble directors, and peers, giving them all of the tools and experiences needed for an active career in the music industry.

#### **Careers and Placement**

Columbus offers all of the benefits of a major music city–venues, jam sessions, recording studios, private gigs and much more. It is also home of the Jazz Arts Group, Columbus Jazz Orchestra, A Tribe for Jazz, and many jazz festivals and performance series. Our graduates can be found teaching at universities, playing with professional big bands, touring around the world with pop artists, recording their own music, hosting podcasts, and working with non-profit arts organizations.

#### **Conservatory Admission and Audition**

Admission into this program will require you to complete a two-part process to gain admittance to both Capital University and the Conservatory of Music. Once you are academically admitted to Capital, you will be required to participate in an audition with your specific instrument or in your area of interest. This will help the Conservatory determine your musical qualifications and placement.
