Gerhold Lecture | Evgeny Kiselev (pronounced Yevghenii Kiseliov) (b.1956) is a Russian-Ukrainian television host, political analyst, and author of a Russian-language YouTube channel bearing his name. He graduated from the Institute of Asian and African Studies at Moscow State University in 1979 majoring in Iranian history and Farsi language and has worked as an interpreter in Iran and Afghanistan. He started his journalistic career in the mid-1980s and has interviewed many prominent politicians, including US Presidents Richard Nixon, Jimmy Carter, and Bill Clinton as well as Secretaries of State Madeleine Albright and Colin Powell. He also interviewed many other world leaders including Michael Gorbachev, Boris Yeltsin, Margaret Thatcher, Václav Havel, and others. Kiselev is an active and animated public speaker, lecturer, radio commentator, columnist, and blogger who collaborates with many print and online media. He has given talks on Ukraine, Russia, international security, and media issues. After Russia launched a full-scale war against Ukraine, he – like many other public critics of Putin's regime – was blacklisted in Russia as an "extremist" and a "foreign agent."
