Behaviors included being in possession of a plant/ivy, late night/early morning phone calls, and requiring new members to buy food items for a member of the organization.	The sorority consisted of initiated and new members from four out of five institutions within central Ohio. The national organization investigated alongside the individual institutions, and the reported conduct was determined to constitute hazing per the national organization's policies. Outcomes: The national organization suspended the membership of current chapter members for the next two years and this action will be recognized and upheld by the respective academic institutions where the students are located, including Capital. Prior to the resumption of recruitment, chapter operations, and other organizational activities on campus, Capital and the other city-wide affiliated institutions will host a joint meeting with the national organization to re-establish recruitment and activity guidelines, as well as expectations surrounding anti-hazing education.	5/17/2024
