KEYBOARD PEDAGOGY

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Conservatory at Capital University is the only institution in the nation that offers an undergraduate Keyboard Pedagogy degree. The program emphasizes study in three distinct areas: piano, organ, and church music. This gives graduates the skills they need to expand their marketability to community and church music settings. The Keyboard Pedagogy curriculum includes unique courses designed to help future teachers establish, market, and manage their own private piano studios. The added training in our program prepares students for participation in choral and other ensemble groups. This degree is best suited for those who have advanced piano proficiency and who wish to become teachers to pre-college and adult learners.

CAREERS AND PLACEMENT

Graduates of this program often find work as musicians in church settings, owning and operating their own piano studios, or teaching piano or organ privately or at a collegiate level. Others have chosen to pursue advanced degrees at notable institutions. The combination of a top quality music education, access to renowned faculty, and curriculum that focuses on establishing your studio business, will strongly prepare you to successfully work in the music industry.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Our students take courses that provide hands-on learning experiences including peer teaching, group and individual instruction, and teacher observation. Students will have many opportunities to observe and interact with learners across different age groups, skill levels, and classroom settings.

As a junior in the program, the coursework and internships focus primarily on pedagogy. The junior year provides a higher level of faculty supervision; as students progress, they move to learning environments with more independence. In the senior year, you'll have opportunities to develop teaching plans, learn about and write studio policies, and dive into the business side of building and marketing a piano studio.
