Capital's Kodály certification program is the only OAKE-endorsed certification program in the state of Ohio. And thanks to Capital's partnership with the renowned Liszt Academy, both MMME and certification students are eligible for study at the Kodály Institute in Hungary.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

- Tuition is assessed on a per credit hour basis. The tuition rate for the 2025-2026 academic year is \$710 per credit hour
- The approximate cost per semester (including tuition and fees) is \$8,300
- Federal financial aid is available to assist in financing your education
- Gregory von Stein & Sandra L. Mathias Scholarship (\$1250) - awarded to an outstanding Level II Kodály student each year
- Employees of our school district partners may qualify to receive credit vouchers toward this program, or you may qualify for other cost savings programs through your school or district
- Capital University accepts the GI bill and other veteran benefits

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. college, university, or approved university outside of the United States
- Undergraduate GPA of 3.0 is preferred

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Online application for the Master of Music in Education
- 200-300 word personal statement
- Résumé or Curriculum Vitae
- Official transcripts for all previous undergraduate and graduate coursework
- Names of three references

DEADLINES

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. We recommend applying by **June 1st**, though application review and admission will continue beyond this date as space permits.
